The National Board of Examiners in Optometry (NBEO) is pleased to announce that registration has been opened for the seventh administration of the **Advanced Competence in Medical Optometry (ACMO)** exam. ACMO 2011 will be administered as a computer-based test at PearsonVue centers across the country on Friday, June 3, 2011. Due to the limited availability of seats at some test centers, the NBEO highly encourages candidates to register as soon as possible. In addition, the NBEO is continuing to offer a tiered ACMO fee structure in which current residents are offered a reduced fee of \$480; the regular examination fee is \$780.

The website also contains the eligibility criteria for ACMO, a description of the examination, 4 sample patient cases and related test items, as well as other examination details.
